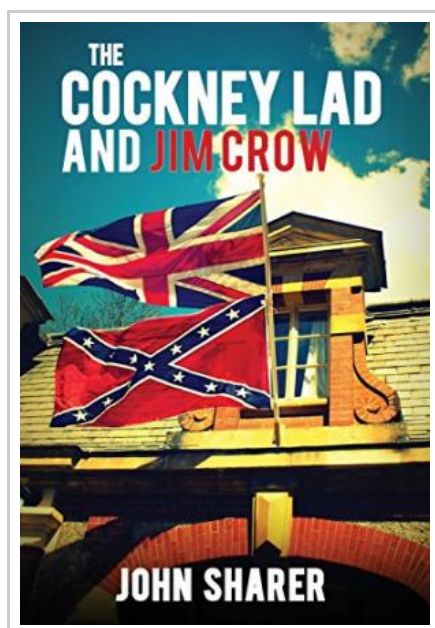




The Cockney Lad and Jim Crow (Hardback)
